

Year-to-Year Change in Nonfarm Jobs SEPTEMBER 2015*



How's the economy?

Juab County's year-over job growth rate moderated to 1.8 percent in September 2015. Education/healthcare, leisure/hospitality, and construction were among those industries adding jobs relative to the previous year. Conversely, government, professional/business services, trade/transportation, and manufacturing industries all saw employment declines. The county unemployment rate was 3.6 percent in December 2015. For the second consecutive quarter, average monthly wages saw strong increases relative to the previous year.

Jobs

Juab County added 60 jobs in September 2015 compared to the prior year, an increase of 1.8 percent.



Four industries accounted for many of the new jobs: Education/health/social services (53), leisure/hospitality (39), other services (17) and construction (16).



The largest employment declines occurred in government (-21), professional/business services (-17), trade/transportation (-14) and manufacturing (-12).



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
Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rate DECEMBER 2015





Initial Claims for Unemployment Insurance

Unemployment and Wages

Juab County's unemployment rate dropped a tenth of a percent in December to an estimated 3.6 percent.



In December, an estimated 178 workers were unemployed while an estimated 4,863 employed Juab residents were either working within the county or commuting to work outside the area.



The average monthly wage increased 7.2 percent in the third quarter of 2015 relative to the previous year.




Construction Permitting JANUARY - NOVEMBER 2015






Change in Nonresidential Values





Construction and Sales

Juab had 36 new dwelling unit permits from January through November 2015, a 38.5 percent increase relative to last year. 

Construction averaged 352 jobs in the third quarter 2015 compared to 322 a year-ago, an increase of 9.4 percent. 

The total permitted value of construction from January through November 2015 was \$17.1 million or 59 percent more than the first 11 months of 2014. 

Taxable sales in Juab County totaled \$27.4 million in third quarter 2015, an increase of 8 percent relative to last year.
